Future Leaders in Prosthodontics (FLiP) workshops were conceived by Sreenivas Koka and Neal Garrett in 2012. The main goal of these workshops was to introduce select fundamentals of leadership science and practice to small groups of aspiring future leaders in academic prosthodontics. Since then, the curriculum has expanded to address leadership challenges in private practice.

The 2 - 2 ½ days workshops are made up of a series of lectures and interactive discussion sessions between workshop faculty and participants. There are morning and afternoon break sessions, an extended lunch session and dinner aiming to encourage socialization and facilitate networking among participants and faculty. Thus, a main goal of FLiP workshops is to facilitate new leadership discoveries, exchanges of ideas among prosthodontists arriving from across the globe, creation of new collaborations and expansion of networking opportunities.

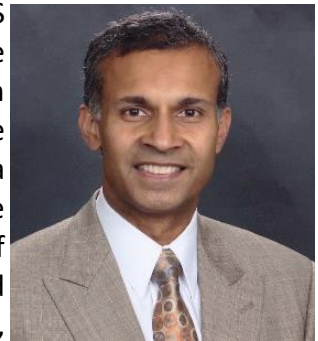

Sreenivas Koka, skoka66@gmail.com. Dr. Sreenivas Koka received DDS and MS (prosthodontics) degrees from The University of Michigan. He joined the University of Nebraska faculty in 1992, became a Diplomate of the American Board of Prosthodontics in 1995, and received his PhD in Oral Biology from the University of Nebraska in 1999. While at the University of Nebraska, Dr. Koka received the Outstanding Teacher Award on numerous occasions and was the inaugural Merritt C. Pedersen Professor of Dentistry. He joined the Staff of Mayo Clinic in 2004 and is former Consultant, former Professor of Dentistry and former Chairman of the Department of Dental Specialties in Rochester, Minnesota. Dr. Koka received an MBA from MIT's Sloan School of Management in 2013 and moved to Zurich, Switzerland to be Executive Director of the Foundation for Oral Rehabilitation. Dr. Koka moved back to the US to focus on patient care and student education and open Koka Dental Clinic, a private practice focused on implant and removable prosthodontics in San Diego. In April 2021, Dr. Koka was appointed as Dean of the University of Mississippi School of Dentistry.

Dr. Koka is past interim Chair of Restorative Dentistry at UCLA School of Dentistry and is also Clinical Professor in Advanced Prosthodontics at Loma Linda University School of Dentistry. He is a Fellow and Past-President of the Academy of Prosthodontics, a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, a member of the ADA/CDA/SDCDS, President of the International College of Prosthodontists, and is Chair of MIT's Sloan School of Management Alumni Board. Dr. Koka has published over 100 journal articles and book chapters and lectures extensively nationally and internationally. Dr. Koka has been a reviewer for NIH grants and been a principal investigator on grants funded by NIH and industry sources. In addition, Dr. Koka is the co-founder of the Future Leaders in Prosthodontics (FLIP) and Shaping the Future of Implant Dentistry (SHIFT) workshop series.



Limor.Avivi.Arber@UToronto.Ca; BSc (Med) & BSc (Pharm) (1986) & DMD (1989) from the Faculty of Dental Medicine, The Hebrew University-Hadassah School of Dental Medicine, Jerusalem; MSc (1994), Diploma in Prosthodontics (1993), PhD and Certificate in Neuroscience (2009) from the University of Toronto, Canada. Limor is a full-time Associate Professor at the Faculty of Dentistry, University of Toronto, teaching prosthodontics, dental occlusion, and oral neurophysiology to graduate and undergraduate students. Her basic research has been funded by the Canadian Institute of Health Research (CIHR), National Institute of Health (NIH) and professional organizations. Her research focuses on neuronal and non-neuronal (e.g., astrocytes) mechanisms underlying the remarkable capacity of the brain to undergo neuroplastic changes following tooth loss and dental implant rehabilitation; such mechanism can determine if and how patients functionally adapt or maladapt to orofacial injury and subsequent rehabilitation. Limor is a Guest Editor in *Frontiers in Neuroscience* for a special research topic issue on “Orofacial Functions: From Neural Mechanisms to Rehabilitation”. She is a member of the editorial board of the *International Journal of Prosthodontics* and the *Journal of Oral Rehabilitation*. Limor is currently the Secretary of the International College of Prosthodontists.

He specialized in Prosthodontics at the Eastman Dental Center in Rochester, New York (1996), where he also completed a one-year training in Orofacial Pain and Temporomandibular Joint Disorders (1997). He achieved specialty certification in Periodontology at the University of Rochester Eastman Institute for Oral Health (2012), and MBA from the Simon Business School of the University of Rochester (2019). He is currently Professor and Chairman of the Prosthodontic Specialty Training Program at the University of Rochester, Eastman Institute for Oral Health and a faculty member of the Periodontology Program.

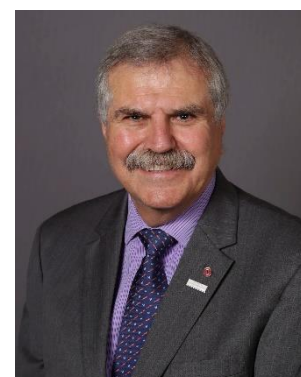

He is an author of the textbook Contemporary Fixed Prosthodontics, the fifth edition of which was published in 2015. 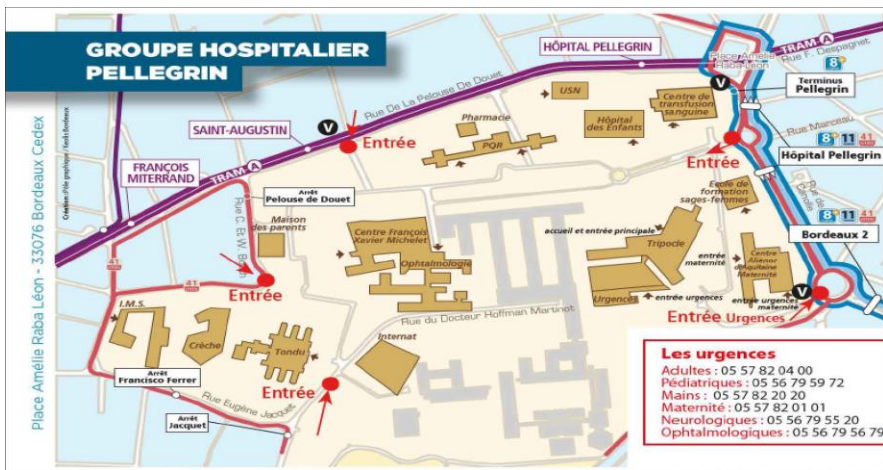
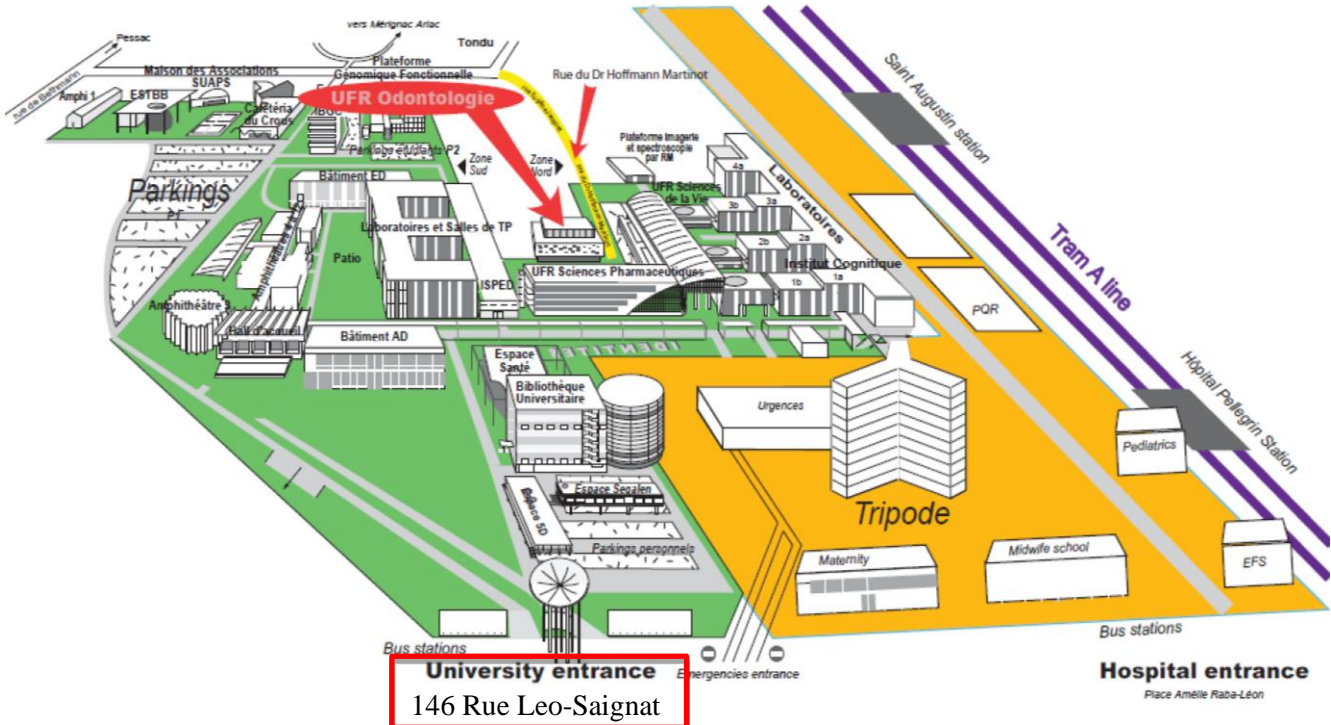

Getting by bus: Buses "lianes 11, 41 and 8" stop at Bordeaux Carreire station, The University entrance.

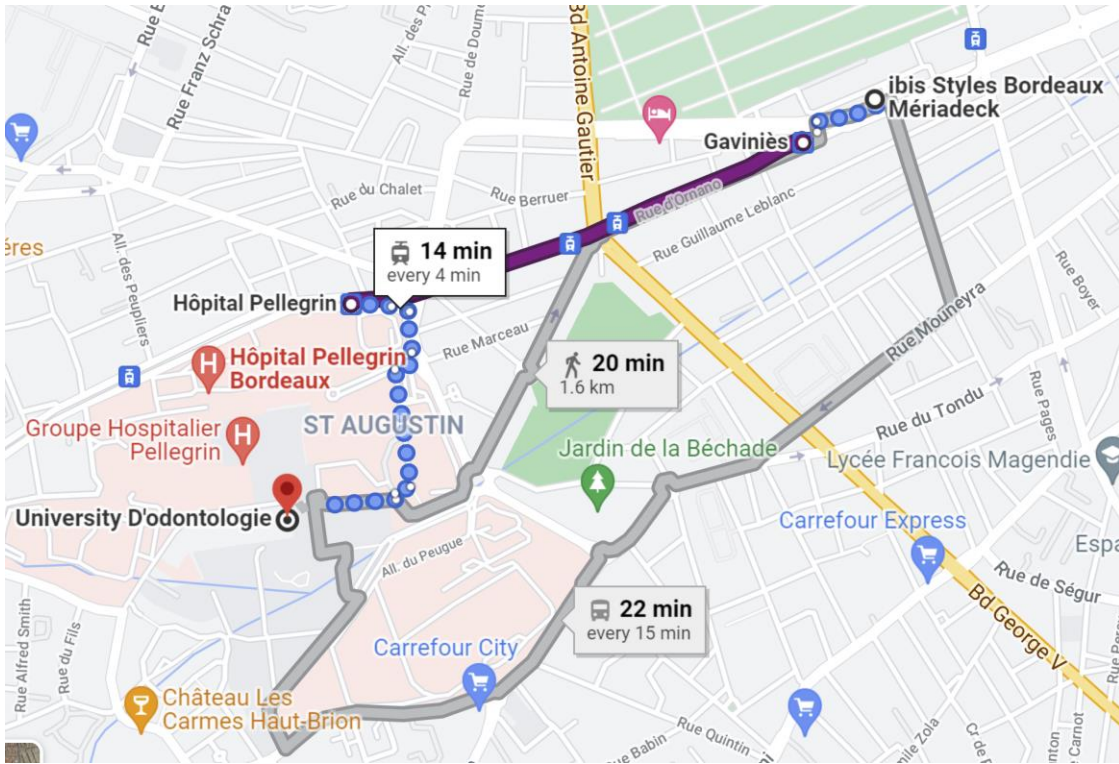

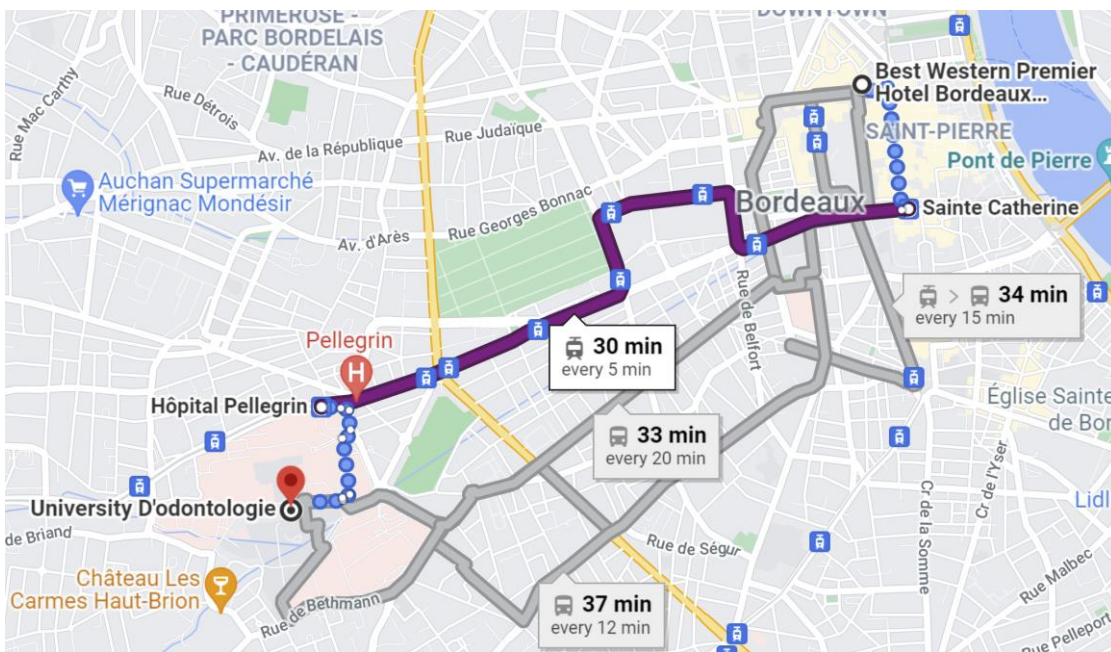

 - o 1,70 Eur
